



Dear Customer,

Your home/apartment will be treated for SILVERFISH on _____.

PREPARATION FOR PROPER APPLICATION OF OUR PRODUCTS IS AS FOLLOWS:

COMPLETELY REMOVE CONTENTS FROM ALL cabinets, closets, drawers, and shelves in each room including, but not limited to KITCHEN, BATHROOM(S), STORAGE AREAS. Also remove any loose shelf paper. Removed items may be placed on a table, chair, bed, etc. DO NOT leave any items on the floor and/or counters of the kitchen and bath(s). Items should be at least 12" away from service areas, such as baseboards.

TARGET TREATMENT AREAS: ALL ACCESSIBLE entry points, ceiling, baseboards, cracks, and crevices. ALL EMPTY drawers, closets, and cabinets.

VACATE THE PREMISES AS FOLLOWS: DO NOT ENTER RESIDENCE UNTIL THE PRODUCT IS COMPLETELY DRIED AND VENTILATED!! Normally, treated premises should be vacated a minimum of 4 to 6 hours. Special precautions may be necessary for young children, pregnant women, the elderly, and residents with health issues including, but not limited to, upper respiratory problems and asthma. These residents should contact their personal physician for recommended re-entry time. Pets should also be out of residence until product completely dries and ventilates. Some animals require longer vacating times due to their respiratory systems (birds/reptiles). Check with your veterinarian for appropriate re-entry times. Please seal all fish aquariums.

VENTILATION: We recommend ventilating your residence before returning by opening a few windows and/or doors.

AFTER TREATMENT: Items may be returned to cabinets/closets when the pesticide is COMPLETELY DRY. Washing the treated areas is not necessary, but you may wipe the MIDDLE of each shelf with a wet cloth. DO NOT WIPE the crack and crevice areas. It is normal to see silverfish for the next 15 days following service. If you see silverfish after 15 days, call our office. Open cracks and crevices in all areas, especially the kitchen and bath(s), should be sealed IMMEDIATELY.

**State law requires that you be given the following information:

CAUTION-PESTICIDES ARE TOXIC CHEMICALS. Structural Pest Control Companies are registered and regulated by the Structural Pest Control Board and apply pesticides which are registered and approved for use by the California Department of Pesticide Regulation and the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Registration is granted when the state finds that, based on existing scientific evidence, there are no appreciable risks if proper use conditions are followed or that the risks are outweighed by benefits. The degree of risk depends on the degree of exposure, so exposure should be minimized. If within 24 hours following application you experience symptoms similar to common seasonal illness comparable to the flu, contact your physician or the Poison Control Center (800) 876-4766 and your pest control company immediately. In the case of anticoagulants, materials may reduce the clotting ability of the blood and cause bleeding.
